IUB child care services

IUB child care services offers early care and education to children of students, staff and faculty in five locations. Three of our centers are professionally staffed and nationally accredited. The other two centers are parent cooperatives where parents are the primary caregivers. In addition, there is a Head Start classroom on campus that serves mostly students in family housing.

The availability of high quality care and education benefits students in a number of ways. Research shows that students who have available, high quality child care have higher GPAs, they have a better retention rate, and they have a higher graduation rate. The availability of campus child care is also a major consideration for students when they chooses a college to attend.

The IUB centers also provide sites for student field placements and research studies done by graduate students and faculty.

Child Care Services receives a small amount (currently \$.39 per student) of student activity fees which goes into the Day Care Support Account that is administered by Suzanne Phillips in the Dean of Students office. Funds from the account go to help centers purchase items or pursue projects that are not within their annual operating budgets. A portion also goes to fund child care fee discounts for student parents.

The Graduate and Professional Student Organization

The Indiana University Graduate and Professional Student Organization (GPSO) provides services to and represent the interests of graduate and professional students on the Bloomington campus. In 2002, the GPSO was recognized by President Myles Brand as the official student government for the post-baccalaureate population at IUB. The GPSO offers the only campus-wide voice to express the concerns and interests of the

graduate and professional student population to the administration, student body, and Bloomington community. All of the approximately 8,000 graduate and professional students at IUB are members of our organization and are encouraged to participate in our many programs, events and services.

In the last six months, the GPSO Executive Committee and Assembly have sought to re-focus the organization and spend funds to strengthen these new directions. To that end, the GPSO has identified the four principal objectives for serving IU students: (1) providing academic and professional support, (2) building a more vital, inter-disciplinary network between IU's graduate and professional students, (3) advocating on behalf of graduate student interests in the campus and Bloomington community and (4) securing resources for graduate education and graduate life at Indiana University.

Indiana Memorial Union

In 1909, John Whittenberger founded the Indiana Union for IU students who desired greater collegiality and commonality amongst the student body. In 1932, the first phase of what is now the Indiana Memorial Union building was opened. From the beginning, the Indiana Memorial Union (IMU) and Union Board's primary purpose has been to offer a center for student life and student activities. The student activity fee provides services and space to students and student organizations at little or no cost to assure that the IMU remains central to

students by serving as a center for recreating, socializing, programming and community-building. Examples of current IMU support for students includes;

Free meeting room usage to registered student organizations.

Office space to student organizations in the Student Activities Tower at the rate of \$1 per square foot.

Hosting hundreds of student internships and jobs.

Providing space for thousands of programs and student-initiated experiences.

The IMU Board of Directors (Union Board) provides hundreds of events for the student body during the year.

The Board is comprised of 20 voting members, of whom 16 are students, and is led by a student President.

IU Outdoor Adventure

IU Outdoor Adventure is the paramount organization on campus that provides once-in-a-lifetime outdoor experiences, from backpacking the Great Smoky Mountains to kayaking the Everglades. Integral to our mission of self-discovery and personal development, IUOA offers students of Indiana University and the surrounding community opportunities for interpersonal connections, leadership development, and academic credit. We are run by dedicated student trip leaders and professional administrative staff. IUOA subsidizes student trip expenses through a percentage allocation of annually received student fees.

Student Legal Services

Dealing with a legal issue while trying to study and get the most out of college can be a huge distraction. As part of the Division of Student Affairs, Student Legal Services (SLS) is a resource that can help reduce the stress and anxiety of legal problems to support the learning experience at Indiana University.

SLS handles the whole range of civil matters, including landlord/tenant issues, employment, veterans' benefits, as well as criminal advice. Our services include litigating cases in local courts and before administrative boards. We have started to expand into services to student groups for such transactional issues as reviewing vendor contracts, liability waivers, risk assessments, and litigation to collect moneys owed. We will take a look at any legal issue, though our charter precludes some specific situations. SLS cannot, for example, take cases against IU, nor can we assist one student against another student. We will also refer clients to the appropriate agencies and offices as needed.

WIUX
